FOUNDATIONS: ROOM 303

We are made up of young parents, couples and singles who study how the teachings of Scripture apply to our lives. Our goals include studying the Bible together, creating pathways for support and fellowship outside of class, and serving others through missions. Our curriculum varies in style, subject, delivery, and leaders from one study to the next.

FRIENDSHIP: ROOM 215

Our class consists of adults who are approximately seventy years and older who care for and value each other, within the class time and outside of it with social events. We study the Bible, spiritual issues, and social issues of today, utilizing Cokesbury's Adult Sunday School Quarterly Curriculum.

GENESIS: ROOM 212

We are a class of adults (approximately fifty-five and up) who are seeking to grow in their faith. To do so, we rely on a discussion-based format primarily utilizing Cokesbury's Adult Sunday School Quarterly Curriculum. We value social gatherings throughout the year as a way to build community together. Additionally, many of our members are involved in local service projects, such as KAIROS & the Community Soup Bowl.

JUST GETTING STARTED: ROOM 306

Our class is composed of young adults in their twenties and thirties, couples and singles, seeking to grow deeper in their faith, build a community of fellowship, and intentionally serve others in meaningful ways.

COVENANT: ROOM 308

We are a class for married and single adults who are in the age range of sixty and up. We focus primarily on Bible Study, however we do so from a rotating group of teachers, sources, and topics which creates a great variety. We enjoy getting together outside of class for social events and also take on various projects throughout the year. We believe fully in supporting each other inside and outside of the class through the good and not-so-good times.

PERSPECTIVES: ROOM 213

A non-traditional Scripture-based Bible study with deep dives into all areas of context behind a text, including our own context now. In our class, we seek to lean into these perspectives, deriving meaning and application for our daily lives. Our format includes presentations, discussion, questions, and occasional answers. All ages, hairdos, and perspectives are welcome. There is no homework, books to read, preparation, or deep sharing required.

LEE: ROOM 110

Our class consists of adults from all walks of life who feel strongly about studying the Bible, caring for each other, and making a difference in our community together. We primarily utilize the Cokesbury Adult Sunday School Quarterly Curriculum, however at times we do vary from it. We are faithful in keeping in touch with each other and caring for each other, especially in times of difficulty.

SISTERS' FELLOWSHIP: ROOM 301

We are a class of women who all come together from very diverse seasons and circumstances of life for fellowship and spiritual growth. We utilize a variety of book studies, sometimes with videos, to engage in discussion and learn from each other.

ARTOS: ROOM 220

Our class seeks to study a wide variety of topics, including Bible studies, spiritual growth, social issues, and church issues. We are a large group of adults who are single, married, widowed, and divorced, caring for each other and participating in numerous missions and social events. We are a highly organized class with a rotating group of leaders in various positions.

BLESSINGS: ROOM 304

We are a mission-based adult class. Most weeks our gathering involves a short devotion and a hands-on mission project. We seek to be a blessing to FUMCT and the Tuscaloosa community while also being a blessing to each other through the community we build during class and outside of it with social gatherings.

NEW LIFE: ROOM 307

Our class consists of married couples ages fifty and up who enjoy learning from each other and participating in activities outside of our class with service projects and dinner socials. We study a variety of interesting topics with a mixture of Bible studies and Christian topics, working to apply them to our faith through discussions. We are friendly, encourage questions, and stay non-political in our topics and discussions.
